

THE LITERARY and HISTORICAL SOCIETY OF QUEBEC, founded in 1824, is the senior learned society in Canada, and the Governors-General have always been its Patrons. The building in which its library is housed was formerly the gaol of Quebec. Among its historical relics are a picce of the katt from which Wolfe directed the attack on the Montmorency Heights, an effigy of Wolfe made in 1771 for an English butcher by a French-Canadian wood-carver, the handle of the first Printing Press in Canada, the last Pillory in Canada, and a model of the ROYAL WILLIAM, called after H. M. King William IV, which ship was built in, and sailed from, Quebec, and was the *first vessel in the world to cross the Atlantic entirely under steam*. This pioneer voyage was made in August, 1833. The *Royal William* was built by
