"Then there are 40 splendidly tailored tweed overcoats, in all the new Scotch and English styles. These I will sell at \$10 each, and the buyers will pocket \$5 and \$10 savings.

"At these prices, Mr. Mack does not anticipate that the January 'Lonely Sale' of 'Semi-ready' mavericks will last more than a fortnight. In the meantime there is a size and type for every man.

RUSSIAN POLICE ROUND UP HUNDRED "RED" LEADERS
 Men and Women Accused of Spreading Seditious in the Army and Navy.

St. Petersburg, Dec. 31.—Acting on information furnished by a traitor, the police during the last few days captured over a hundred leaders and members of the Social Democratic organization of the Social Democrats, who were conducting a propaganda in the army and navy. Among those taken into custody was the editor of a paper secretly published entitled "The Barracks," 20 soldiers and several women. The police also arrested many members of an important group of terrorist social revolutionists and several nationalist factions. A list of 27 officials, who had been selected to die. Finally it is asserted that the police accidentally obtained information which frustrated a plot to blow up a number of persons at a conference which was to be held in the near future.

Arrests of members of the military organization which was responsible for the Sveaborg and Kronstadt outbreaks and the mutinies on board warships on the Baltic squadron in August have been reported from various places in the interior, notably at Moscow, in which city the central committee was transferred after the police had twice broken up the headquarters at Yva. Six officers, including Col. Klopoff, who had distinguished themselves in their respective services, were captured while holding a conference at Moscow. Lieut. Zemlin, Janoff, who was executed at Sveaborg fortress in August for participation in the mutiny, was also a member of this organization.

Forty Arrests.

Kiev, Russia, Dec. 31.—The local committee of the social democrats, consisting of forty men, were arrested here to-day.

Disasters at Lodz.

Lodz, Russian Poland, Dec. 31.—Sklirishes resulting in occasional fatalities continued to take place between the socialist and nationalist factions. During the night six persons were killed or wounded.

JAPS FLOCKING TO MEXICO.

Not Laborers Alone, But Men of High Degree.

City of Mexico, Dec. 31.—A despatch to The Herald from Guadalajara says that the migration of Japanese brought to this country under contract to work on the Manzanillo extension of the Mexican Central Railroad continues.

CHINESE RENEW BOYCOTT.

Large Meeting Decides to Resume Agitation Against U.S.

Hongkong, Dec. 31.—Despatches received from Canton report that over 1000 persons were present at a meeting held to discuss the American Chinese Exclusion Act.

TRAIN ROBBERY IN VIRGINIA

Two Men "Go Thru" Sleeper

Richmond, Va., Dec. 31.—Near La Crosse, Va., on the seaboard Air Line railway, two men, who were riding the sleeper of train No. 81, out of Richmond, were held up and robbed of about \$200 besides jewelry.
