The company got their charter and special act from the legislature three years ago. They have enough land to go ahead with, and have already got a lot of material upon the ground. If the company do not succeed in getting all the property where they need it, they will build around that held at high figures. The expropriation bylaw will likely carry in Council by one vote, but it is difficult to say just how the Council will deal with it. So many are amenable to late impressions that much will depend upon the views of citizens who have used their influence over Councillors since last they met. Mayor Armstrong is decidedly in favor of the bylaw, and it will not be his fault if it is not passed.


