MOST SERIOUS DANGER.

Reckless Stock Speculating May Injure Canadian Prosperity.

Prof. Adam Shortt of Queen's University spoke to the effect of the Canadian Club at their luncheon in McCone's last evening upon the subject of British trade in relation to German and American competition. Rev. D. Bruce Macdonald, president, occupied the chair, and about 150 members of the club and their friends were in attendance. Prof. Shortt's address was clear and interesting. He pointed out that so far as facts proved, British trade had nothing to fear from either Germany or America. That Germany was passing through a period of hard times, and that the real balance of trade, as compared with America, was distinctly in favor of Great Britain, when figures were properly considered. He quoted statistics in support of his statements in this connection. He dwelt upon the good times being enjoyed in Canada at present, and saw no reason why they should not continue to exist. The most serious danger that Canada stood in the way of was that of reckless dealings on the part of stock speculators, resulting in the placing of false values upon stocks, which would afterwards drop, and to a certain extent, cripple the particular trade affected.

At the conclusion a vote of thanks was tendered Prof. Shortt on motion of E. R. Penock, seconded by E. A. Hiestris. At the next luncheon, on Monday evening, Rev. J. A. Macdonald, Ald. Curry and J. E. Atkinson will lead in a discussion on municipal reform. Wycliffe won on style.
