

QUERIES REGARDING MILITARY SERVICE

Address Your Problems to the Milltary Editor of The Advertiser and They W.II Be Answered From Off .cial Information.

ANXIOUS WIFE. Q.—Is my husband entitled to a furlough to Canada, having served overseas for three years, and was wounded twice? He is now stationed in Eng-

land.
A.—He is entitled to the furlough A.—He is entitled to the furlough from the citizens' point of view, but it is a lamentable fact that the Government cannot see its way clear to allow such war scarred veterans as your husband a brief respite in Canada, which they have earned. The authorities stated that no furloughs would be considered at present, owing to the pressing need for men, so you will have to carry on as you have been during his absence, and like hundreds of other Canadian wives and mothers wait and hope for a change of policy in the near future.

SUBSCRIBER. Q .-- Would a mar-SUBSCRIBER. Q.—Would a married man, an American citizen resident in Canada, have to register on or before September 28, when he registered June 22?

2.—If so, where should he register?

3.—If he did register in Canada would he be classed the same as the married men in Canada, or would he be subject to United States classification?

1.—Yes.

1.—Yes. 2.—A. E. Bischoff, London Free Press, Richmond street, London, Ont., is the registrar for Americans in this district. 3.—He can elect to serve under the United States draft law, or the Canadian military service act. If he takes the latter he would be classed with the narried men of Canada.

2.—Can a W.O.R. drafted soldier volunteer for this force?
3.—Where is the Siberian force to be trained? be trained?
A.—1.—Yes. The complement to be ecruited in this district is now up to recruited in this district is now up to full strength, but orders have been received here to continue recruiting until further notice.

2.—Yes. He should apply to his commanding officer for a transfer.

3.—Infantry platoons recruiting here are training at Carling Heights, although The Advertiser is informed that they will leave for Military District No. 2 (Toronto) in the near future.

A.—No. If you have registered and the United States authorities are in possession of your Canadian address, and you carry the necessary papers on your person to produce if accosted by the police, you are obeying the draft treaty, and can remain in Canada indefinitely until ordered to return to the United States by the military authorities there.

amount assigned about the 20th day each month. BARRIER IS REMOVED ON SOME COMMODITIES

The war trade board, import license epartment, has advised the local board of trade that certain import restrictions have been removed on a number of commodities much needed from Great Britain by Canadian manufacturers. They are as follows: Burlap, cotton and manufactures of cotton, furs and manufactures of fur, glass and glassware, optical glass, manufactures of glasses, textiles and vegetable fibres. jute, oilcloth and linoleum for floors. wool and manufactures of wool. For goods that are not included in the above list it will be necessary for importers to apply for permission for their importation on form O, copies of which can be secured at the board of trade

The removal of restrictions referred to will affect textile manufacturers, manufacturers of men's and women's ware and binder twine, straw braid for hats and flax yarns, and it is calculated, will bring about a freer movement of commodities from Great Britain to Canada according to Secretary Gordon ada, according to Secretary Gordon Philip of the board of trade.


