A.—Present regulations state that no further harvest leave is to be granted extending beyond October 31, and his commanding officer has no power to grant him this leave under present regulations, although they may be altered in the near future.

Draftee: Q.—My exemption expires on November 1. I have worked at laboratory dental work for three years. Would I be allowed to transfer to the Army Dental Corps on reporting to the Western Ontario Regiment If the military authorities knew my qualifications?

A.—You might be allowed to do so, but if you really desire to serve in the Army Dental Corps it would be advisable for you to enlist in this branch of the service before being ordered to report for service. If you are the only remaining son at home you are entitled to indefinite leave of absence on furnishing proof of same to your commendating officer.
