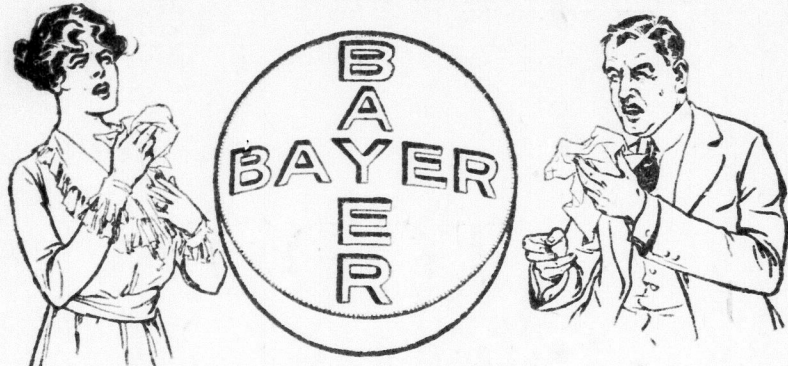

DEMAND PROBE OF H. C. OF BUILDING MATERIAL AT BORDER

Windsor May Have Artificial Gas Plant in Near Future.

O. T. A. FINES TOTAL \$3,000

Police Believe They Have Clue To Murderers of Rapportta.

WINDSOR, March 11.—Institution of a probe into the high cost of building materials in Windsor and investigation into charges of profiteering will be urged upon the Windsor City Council at its meeting next Monday night by Ald. Sam Keyser. He declared tonight that he will also ask for a thorough inquiry into the general housing situation in the Border Cities, with a view to effecting a remedy.

ARTIFICIAL GAS.
Establishment of an artificial gas plant in Windsor to furnish fuel and supply the needs of the district overlooked through shortage of the natural product, is a possibility. When the plant of the Canadian Steel Corporation at Ojibway commences operations gas for fuel will be one of the by-products available.

WANT CHANGES MADE.
Improvements in the government's present re-establishment program for returned men, increased gratuities, organized political action by veterans and adoption of the open-door policy for membership in the G. W. V. A. will be strongly advocated by Robert H. Harrison, member of the provincial G. W. V. A. executive, who promises to take a prominent part at the annual convention, which assemblies next week at Peterboro.

OPPOSE ARMSTRONG BILL.
Strong opposition to the Armstrong bill in the House of Commons, which provides for placing the control over Great Lakes vessels under the jurisdiction of the railway commission, thus eliminating competition between rail and water transportation, is being supported by the Border Chamber of Commerce, co-operating with trade boards in other centres throughout Canada.

Members of the Windsor and Detroit real estate boards conferred tonight in Detroit on the inland waterways development scheme and drafted a program in support of the project for the deepening of the St. Lawrence River. Engineers of the provincial government are now surveying the waterfront on this section of the border.

WHISKEY, SILVER, CASH.
Entering the residence of F. A. Stockbach, Walkerville, while the owner and his family were asleep, burglars secured 25 cases of whiskey, \$400 in silverware and \$50 in cash. The police have no clue.

Capt. Frank C. Pratt City, for 20 years one of the best known of Great Lakes sailors, died at Harper Hospital, Detroit, today, aged 47 years. Deceased was a life-long resident of the Border cities, having been born in Sandwich, for the past fifteen years he had captained the freighter B. F. Berry of the Frankland Steamship Company, Cleveland. He is survived by a widow and two children.

Members of the Essex and Kent Printers' Association have been summoned to the first convention of the organization, held since 1916. The session will be held in the Crawford House, Windsor, Monday, March 28.

DIED OF CONVULSIONS.
Joseph Ellison Young, aged 2 years, only child of J. Ellison Young, managing editor of the Border Cities Star, died early this morning from convulsions. A funeral will be held from the home of the child's grandparents.

Dr. and Mrs. Fitzsimmons, St. Thomas, cell at police headquarters with a chair and threatening to burn down the city hall and St. Andrew's church. Margaret Cross, aged 22, arrested recently on a charge of vagrancy, has been sent to the London asylum, of which she was formerly an inmate.

OVER \$3,000 IN FINES.
Fines amounting over \$3,000 were collected in Windsor police court today, when judgment was given by Magistrate Miers in fourteen cases involving

breaches of the Ontario temperance act, which have been pending for several weeks. Only one of the defendants was acquitted.

Announcement was made tonight of the sale of the business block at Sandwich street and Ouellette avenue, one of the four corners at the heart of Windsor's business district, by Dr. J. R. Reame, county registrar and former minister of public works in the Whitney cabinet, to the Home Bank of Canada for \$100,000.

Exchange on Canadian and American money fluctuated again today, the discount on Canadian currency advancing to 12 per cent.

Following a new clue which developed tonight, when the ownership of the automobile in which the murders of Morris Thompson, Wyandotte, street, merchant, escaped following the slaying on Saturday night, Detective Reid of the Windsor police department hopes cars of mail.

Halifax, March 12.—The steamship Royal George, from New York for Port of Spain, arrived here last night. She will take on 210 passengers, 4 members of the crew of the Bohemian, and 1 of the Windsor police department hopes cars of mail.
