KIDNAP FOUR DURING FIT AND SUICIDES

Demented With Rage Have- lock Veinott First Shoots His Father.

HALIFAX, N. S., Sept. 19.—In a fit of demented rage, resulting from a long-standing dispute over the location of a mill dam on or near his father's property at Hemford, Lunenburg County, Havelock Veinott, this morning at that place shot and killed three men, including his father, and one woman, and then committed suicide.

The victims of the tragedy are Mr. and Mrs. Archibald Ritchie, Abner Snyder and William Veinott, father of the murderer.

Had Uttered Threats.
The villagers of Hemford for some time had considered Havelock Veinott mentally unbalanced. He had on several occasions threatened the lives of the three men who are dead.

Some time ago Snyder and Ritchie wished to build the dam and asked the elder Veinott to agree thereto. He refused, but a month later reconsidered and signed the agreement. The son, who had been opposed to the plan from the first, became enraged and quarrelled repeatedly with his father.

Veinott was unmarried and lived with his parents.

This morning the argument was renewed with great heat. The father flatly refused to break the contract whereupon the son secured his rifle and in a frenzy of passion shot his father in the stomach. He then left the house, threatening to kill the other two men.

Planned for Husband's Life.
Fearing for the lives of his neighbors, the elder Veinott, though seriously wounded, made his way to the nearest telephone and gave the alarm. Meanwhile the murderer went to the Ritchie home, forced his way into a bedroom and shot Ritchie and his wife, both in the head. Leaving the two dying, he ran to the Snyder home.

Snyder answered his summons, and Veinott shot him. Snyder stumbled back to his bedroom, followed by his murderer, who shot him again, his fourth victim dying almost immediately in the arms of his wife, who had pleaded with Veinott for mercy for her husband.

Making his way back to his home, he found his wounded father returned from his painful trip and retreating to bed. He then fired a bullet through his father's heart. He said a few words to his mother and then went to the barn, where he put a bullet through his own head.

SHORTAGE OF CARS AFFECTS SHIPMENTS OF WESTERN GRAIN

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Sept. 18.—With wheat bins in Kansas City elevators practically empty and with railroads inadequate to meet the demand for shipments to other markets and for export, a serious shortage of grain is clearly reflected here.

Slightly less than 2,000,000 bushels are now stored in elevators, which have a capacity of between 15,000,000 and 20,000,000 bushels. A year ago the supply was nearly 8,000,000.

The shortage of cars for grain shipment in the southwest has never been more acute, according to grain company officials here.

A critical situation in business and financial circles was predicted by local grainmen unless the car situation is improved. It will take 38 months at the present rate of shipping to move wheat now in Kansas, according to Judge Clyde M. Reed of the Kansas courts. Most local railroads are investigating the car shortage.

FLYNN PROPOSES RADICAL MEASURE TO GIVE BONUSES

Conscript Hearings of War Profiteers for Fighting Men's Benefit.

SIZES UP GOVERNMENT
Grand Army Enters Windsor With Incisive Address by Recalcitrant Veteran.

WINDSOR, Sept. 19.—Conscription of war profiteers' holdings by the Government to provide adequate soldier bonuses was a demand voiced by Harry Flynn of the Grand Army of United Veterans, during the course of a lengthy address to the newly-organized branch of that body here this afternoon.

Mr. Flynn declared that while slackers waxed fat on the high wages paid in war industries the returned soldiers are getting the dregs. His address was a categorical denunciation of the principal members of the Borden administration. The ex-patriot himself was charged with acres of broken promises made to the soldiers while they were on the battlefield.

Senator O'Brien Robertson was scored on his alleged remark that the Government was providing work for the returned men by placing them on good roads work. "I asked him," said Flynn, "how he would like to take such a job."
