SHORTAGE OF CARS AFFECTS SHIPMENTS OF WESTERN GRAIN

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Sept. 18.-With practically empty and wheat arrivals inadequate to meet the demand for shipments to other markets and for export, the freight car shortage is clearly reflected here.

Slightly less than 2,000,000 bushels are now stored in local elevators, which have a capacity of between 15,000,000 have a capacity of between 15,000,000 and 20,000,000 bushels. A year ago the supply was nearly 9,000,000. The amount in storage here has increased only a few thousand bushels since the harvest.

The shortage of cars for grain shipment in the southwest has never been more acute, according to grain company officials here.

A critical situation in ousiness and financial circles was predicted by local grainment unless the car situation is improved. It will take 28 months at the present rate for the railroads to move wheat now in Kansas, according to Judge Clyde M. Reed of the Kansas court of industrial relations, who is investigating the car shortage.

FLYNN PROPOSES RADICAL MEASURE

Grand Army Enters Windsor With Incisive Address by Recalcitrant Veteran.

WINDSOR, Sept. 19.—Conscription of war profiteers' hoardings by the Government to provide adequate soldier bonuses was a demand voiced by J. Harry Flynn of the Grand Army of United Vetersns, during the course of a lengthy address to the newly-organized branch of that body here this afternoon.

ternoon.

Mr. Flynn declared that while slackers waxed fat on the high wages paid in war industries the returned soldiers are getting the dregs.
