This will enable him to have green and Hot house Plants for Sale next Summer. The house will be 50 by 20 feet and none in this province on the same plan, or in his Majesty's dominions are less costly: houses can be built after his plan at half the cost of those constructed after the former method. Should the proprietor obtain sufficient encouragement, his establishment may be converted into a Botanical Garden, with little expense.
