During the year. 12 boys have been received into the Home. Ten of these are from the city, while two are from other sources During the same period, ten have left, their indentures having expired; thus giving us 42 boys in all in the institution during the twelve months.

In the Industrial Department, where, of necessity the boys spend the greater part of their time, it will be interesting to the subscribers and friends to know that we have every reason to be satisfied with our returns, financially and otherwise.
