Non-Crying Blue-Eyed Baby Seeks Home; Apply to Mother

No Lack of Maternal Love for Tiny Christopher Pappas, but There's a Hungry Two-Year-Old to Feed, Father Is Missing, So He's on the Market.

Wrapped in a pale blue shawl on the kitchen table and contentedly pulling at his bottle, tiny Christopher Pappas awaited yesterday the results of an advertisement which offered him for adoption.
His mother, Mrs. Regina Pappas, in the dark basement room at 817 West Thirty-fifth street, which she calls home, greeted applicants for the child with a matter-of-fact recital of her troubles.
"My husband—he goes away," she said. "Never come here any more. I have other baby, two years old. I must go to work and make money for other baby. I give this one away. You take it."
She was a neat little woman, in a room that shone with the cleanliness that is automatic among "natural-born housekeepers," whatever their status in life. The tiny shelves were draped with shining blue and white oilcloth, and over the kitchen stove hung a line of freshly washed linen and lace-trimmed baby clothes. The month-old Christopher was daintily dressed, and his blue eyes opened and shut with the utter content of a well-cared-for baby.
"He never cries," his mother said hopefully, mentioning what she evidently considered his best selling point. She is of Greek birth, and worked in a cigarette factory before she was married, she said, adding that she would go back to that work as soon as she found a home for the baby. She said that her husband sent her a little money once in a while, but not enough to live on.
"I don't care where he is," she said. "I don't care—any more."
Mrs. Pappas had reached the point where she didn't care about anything—any more. The stark problem of earning a living for herself and a two-year-old child had erased any pang she might otherwise have felt about giving away a month-old son. There were no tears, no apparent sorrow, nothing but plain facts in her statement.
"I cannot make money for two babies. You think somebody take?"
