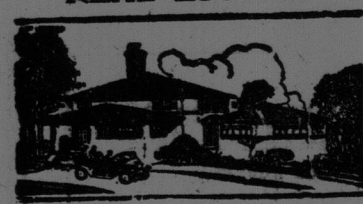

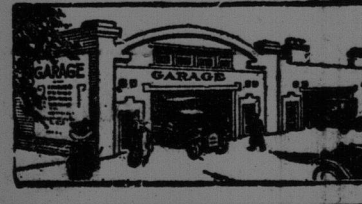

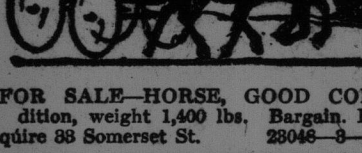

DR. CUMMING ON LEPROSY. Surgeon General Says the Disease is Still a Problem.

Though leprosy is comparatively rare in Continental United States, according to Surgeon-General Cummings of the U. S., it is still a public health problem of much greater seriousness than seems to be popularly supposed. Its virulence waxes and wanes in accordance with laws that are not known, and he says, "our present comparative immunity does not lessen the necessity for being on guard."

"In the past we have not escaped," he continues, in a bulletin of the Health Service on the disease. "In 1789 leprosy began to be common in New Orleans that they had to be segregated in a leprosarium. In 1864, three per cent of the population of the Hawaiian Islands were lepers. In 1890 California had to establish a leprosarium, and Louisiana and finally Massachusetts fol- lowed."

In 1902 the Public Health Service found 278 lepers in the United States, 145 of whom had been born in this country, and seventy-three only of whom were under any restraint. Today, ac- cording to the best estimate obtainable, there are from 500 to 1,500 lepers in this country, a number of whom are known to have acquired the disease in the Philippines. When we acquired the Philip- pines several thousand lepers had to be deported to the United States and still are segregated in a settlement at Cullon. Foci of the disease exist in the United States on the Pacific Coast, in the Northwest, in the Gulf States and along the Atlantic seaboard."

"It was not until 1889 that the United States government took its first steps to prevent lepers from coming to this country; and the preventive laws are now sufficiently explicit. Nevertheless, the long period during which the disease incubates before declaring itself makes it very difficult to shut out all potential lepers. To meet this difficulty the law provides that for three years after ad- mission, any alien leper may be de- ported if the cause of the disease existed before he came to the United States. Within the United States lepers may not travel in interstate commerce ex- cept under permits prescribing special precaution to prevent the spread of the disease."

"Protection against the disease is ren- dered more difficult by the fact that leprosy is found in a very large portion of the habitable globe, ranging from Rus- sia and Iceland to India and America, north and south, and that the ever-in- creasing ease of communication offers many facilities for its importation to the United States. Nine lepers were turned back at Quarantine during the fiscal year 1920-21."

"In February, 1919, Congress provided for a national home for lepers to be administered by the Public Health Service; but so strongly did the various states object to the founding of such an asylum within their borders that it was not until four years later that the service was able to carry out the provisions of

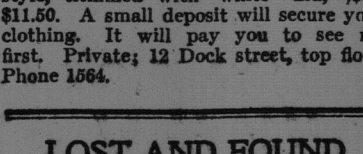

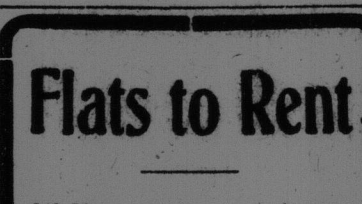
the act by acquiring the state leper home in Louisiana. Part of this home has been remodeled, and work on the re- maining necessary alterations and ad- ditions is proceeding.

"The gloomy outlook for lepers has recently been tinged with hope by the discovery of a mode of treatment in- volving the use of chaulmoogra oil, which for 200 years has been reputed to be of beneficial effect for leprosy. Since 1912 a total of 183 patients have been paroled from the Kala Hospital Service in Hawaii (140 of them since July 9, 1919) as being apparently cured. Of those who have received the chaulmoogra oil derivatives only twelve (eight per cent) have returned for further treatment."

"While it is too early to say that a specific cure for the disease has been found, it is certain that the ethyl esters constitute a most valuable agent in the treatment of leprosy, especially for young persons and those in the early
