RHODES SCHOLARS

The election of Rhodes scholars, postponed on account of the war, will be resumed throughout Canada during the present year. As the Oxford Colleges cannot receive more than a given number of Rhodes scholars at one time, it has been necessary to make special arrangements for filling the postponed scholars.

In New Brunswick, the Provincial University in Nova Scotia, Acadia University, nominate the scholar. The date of election, which must not be later than Oct. 1, 1939, will be fixed by the committee of selection in these universities. The scholars-elect will be expected to come into residence at Oxford not later than January, 1940.

GERMAN OPERAS ARE BANNED IN NEW YORK

New York, Mar. 10.—At the instance of Mayor Hylan and Police Commissioner Haright, who declared that the projected performances might provoke disorder, the management of the Lexington Theatre today cancelled arrangements for a season of German operas, the first of which was to be presented tonight.
