prices but makes allowance for varying conditions in varying zones. After making inquiries upon which we are now starting and establishing machinery to continue them we will be able to ascertain what is the actual cost and then determine what is a fair profit thereon. The next step will be to set a date at which the price, the result of the fixation of profits, will be effective. These prices will be lower than what now prevail. Meanwhile commerce will have to beat down to the level decided on. We will then issue an order restraining

We will then issue an order restraining and enjoining all persons in a particular line and zone from selling at a price including a profit greater than what is determined.






