THE PENNSYLVANIA HORROR.

Further Details of Horror, Death and Crime.

Johnstown, Pa., June 2.—The situation is unchanged, and yesterday's estimate of the loss of life is not exaggerated. Six hundred bodies are now being interred. A large number are still in the morgue. Four immense relief trains arrived last night. The survivors are being well cared for. A portion of the police force of Pittsburgh and Allegheny are on duty. Communication has been established between Cambria City and Johnstown and the work of repairing the tracks between Sang Hollow and Johnstown is going on rapidly. Trains will probably be running to-morrow.

There are 1500 strangers here, and on a sort of west bank for two miles, not over 100 bodies were seen. The mass of strange faces walking back and forth and only a few residents of the vicinity were seen, which leads to the belief that hundreds—perhaps thousands—are still buried in the mud and debris, buried in the furnace and in the brick and further down than the searchers have yet gone. A fresh corpse is dug up every few hours, though no thorough search in the mud and debris has yet commenced. The color from the mud on the river bank indicates a heavy loss of life.

The work of getting the bodies together is being done by the Pennsylvania State Police. A large number of the bodies have been buried in the mud, but between them standing over were several men and women who had been identified. Many of the bodies have not been identified. From the wreck of St. Mary's German Catholic church, about a mile below, the streets are filled with broken bones and the people in the street are busy shoveling mud from the first floors today. In a row, among them five children, from two to six years of age, were seen. A number of bodies lie in the fourth ward street, and some of them still unidentified. Men were at work in the lower York Catholic cemetery this afternoon digging trenches. The bodies were exposed when the water began falling, and in a bad condition. Some were already buried. The water had been receding and there is great danger from falling walls. All day long the water has been heard across the river. Where it is a bad case of something like a placid lake, the passage went away and the water was still.

James M. Walters, an attorney, was at home with his family. He had been struck by lightning. His family drifted on the roof in another direction. He was down several streets and he will be taken to a hospital. His dwelling struck that office and he was thrown into his own office on the second floor. About 200 persons took refuge in the hall of the second, third and fourth stories and spent the night there in darkness. The scenes were most agonizing and heart-rending. Strips of clothing and means fairly piling the gloomy night. For hours in prayer, applications mingling with the roar of the return and the sound of the dying in the surrounding houses. In all this misery two women gave premature birth to children. Dr. Matthews, although several ribs were crushed by falling timbers and his wife was most severely attended the sick. A woman and seven children died of a cooling day as a result of terrible suffering.

All Mr. Walters' family were saved. Chief Evans of the Pittsburg fire department arrived this evening with engines and several hose carts, and a full complement of men. Several Pittsburg physicians came on the same train. Four thieves were caught rifling lead cases in the afternoon and were taken into the river and drowned. Two others were tracked.

Johnstown, Pa., June 2.—James McMillen, vice president of the Cambria City, threat with a razor. The coroner's jury returned the following verdict: "That the deceased James McMillen, was killed by the lightning which struck the upper mill machinery and all buildings are neglected. Mills will be rebuilt. The gutter wire works are completely destroyed and will be rebuilt immediately. They are owned and operated by the Cambria Iron Co. The gutter wire works today is barren and desolate. The Cambria Iron Co. loses its great supply of steam and the damage to the stock will be valued at \$50,000. The company's offices are almost totally destroyed. The value of the loss of the Cambria iron works are given as \$2,000,000 to \$2,500,000.
