AFRAID OF BISMARCK.

WHAT IS THE FRENCH GOVERNMENT'S MOTIVE?

RETURN OF BISMARCK TO PARIS. (Special to the Gazette.)

PARIS, Feb. 8.—De Freycinet, addressing to Colonel Senart order of the day, commenting on the action of the German authorities in refusing a passport to the French army surgeon who wished to visit Strasbourg to see his dying mother, has instructed the Commandant-in-chief to report on the matter with a view to the punishment of the offender.

Most papers here think that Senart ought to be formally censured. Also that he should be thanked by every Frenchman for his indications of the laws of humanity and his courage in showing respect for the French army surgeon who wished to visit Strasbourg to see his dying mother.

The Secretary of the German Embassy expresses Count Von Munster of any animus. He says the passport was refused because the sergeant failed to obtain an official permit from the Strasbourg police.

Bismarck has unexpectedly returned to the city. He considers his presence necessary in view of the coming business in the Chamber of Deputies. He is accompanied by a tour of the South, later when he will continue to Italy and Rome.

Bismarck, Feb. 8.—The North German Gazette says: The French papers that published Senart's order, have added fuel to the new-born Chauvinism in France. A clear light has been thrown upon the manner in which the French papers and the anti-German propaganda in the army, the French press marches at the head of the most reckless and incited of war and will no longer be able to hide its real thoughts and longings under an occasional pretence of a desire for peace.

FIRE IN A SPANISH HOSPITAL.
