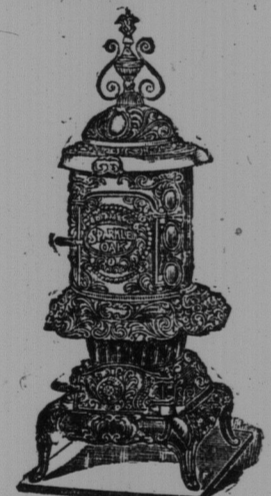

THE SCOTT ACT FOR ST. JOHN.

Temperance People May Bring It Into Force.

Dissatisfied at the Government's Refusal to Grant Reforms a Campaign Will Be Begun.

The temperance people have not yet set a date for a meeting to consider the reply of the Tweed government to the petition which they presented in March last, but the Star has reason to believe that the date for such a meeting will be fixed in the immediate future.

A leading official of the Sons of Temperance in speaking to the Star this morning outlined briefly the temperance people asked for provincial prohibition, but, of course, as they expected, the government refused absolutely to consider such a proposition.

Among the other principal reforms asked by the temperance people was a change in the hours during which liquor saloons can be open. The present hours are from six o'clock in the morning till ten at night, except on Saturdays when the closing hour is seven o'clock.

Most of the minor reforms asked by the temperance people had been brought out, among them the proposal that screens for the saloons be provided, that the government should make a number of minor concessions.

SUNDAY SCHOOL CONVENTION

What Promises to be a Most Successful Gathering Opened Today at Woodstock.

WOODSTOCK, N. B., Oct. 11.—The twentieth convention of the New Brunswick Sunday School Association opened in the Reformed Baptist church this morning. Up to 11 o'clock some forty-three delegates had registered and on the noon train the number is expected to be so large as to bring up the total attendance to two hundred.

KUROPATKIN ATTACKING; GREAT BATTLE IS RAGING.

Russians in Heavy Force Assault Japanese Positions—General Engagement On—Jap Gunboat Sunk With Over 200 Men.

TOKIO, Oct. 11.—(4 p. m.)—It is reported that the Russians have crossed the Hun river in heavy force and are aggressively attacking the Japanese forces, which were moving northward.

JAP WARSHIP SUNK. TOKIO, Oct. 11, 3 p. m.—The Japanese gunboat Heyon struck a mine in Pigeon Bay, west of Port Arthur, Sept. 18 and sank.

Another Japanese gunboat named Heyon, but they contain the name of a Japanese coast vessel, the Hel Yen, which may be the warship destroyed.

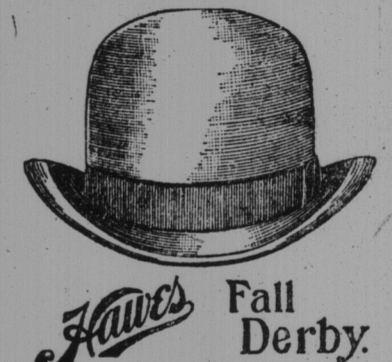
