IS SHY OF CASH

TO BUY HUSBAND

Had Only \$157, So Girl With Mortgage, Who Wanted \$300 Married Him

NEW YORK, April 2.—Because Mary Barna did not have enough money to buy Steve Gurick, he is now the husband of another woman. He was married to Annie Markovics by Judge Owen Mahon in a public court in Elizabeth, N. J. Steve himself had very little to do with it, except in the beginning.

It appears that Steve had engaged himself to both women, but Annie had first claim. Mary offered her \$157, all she had saved, but Annie said she was worth \$300, and she would not sell him for a cent less. Then Mary said she would pay the \$157 down to bind the bargain and \$1 a week until Steve was fully paid for, but Annie again refused.

Mary took the matter into court on a charge of breach of promise, but the judge decided that Steve belonged to Annie, and that Mary had recognized the fact by trying to buy him from her. So Steve and Annie were married, while Mary looked on.

MARRIED, FORGETS, THEN PROPOSES

Wooer Arrested as He is About to Wed for the Third Time

The marriage line set so lightly on the mind of Harry J. Jones that he forgot all about the fact that he had a wife at home when he proposed marriage to Miss Emma de Silva, a pretty young Brooklyn girl.

When Miss de Silva accompanied him to the Bowery Hall, Brooklyn, giving him her correct name and address, she heard him swear to the statement that he had never before been married. Miss de Silva learned, just in time to stop the wedding, that she was about to become a Mrs. Jones No. 2 or No. 3.

Yesterday Jones was arrested on a charge of perjury brought by Miss de Silva.

Jones said he was first married in Philadelphia in 1903. He and his wife did not agree, and they separated. In 1905 Jones met and married his present wife in this city without the formality of a legal separation or divorce. The possibility of Jones already being a bigamist was not thought of until he betrayed himself after his arrest.

CHURCH WON'T LET HIM WED; DIVORCEE SUES

Asks \$25,000 Damages Because He Refuses to Marry Without Dispensation

PITTSBURGH, Pa., April 2.—Because Charles Holman, a merchant of Carnegie, could not get a special dispensation from the pope to marry Mrs. Annie Pecha, a divorcee, and because he refused to be united to her by any other than a religious ceremony, he has been sued for \$25,000 damages for alleged breach of promise of marriage.

Mrs. Pecha alleges that Holman asked her to marry him in 1903 and she consented, but that Holman has refused to carry out his contract.

In his answer, Holman says both parties are Roman Catholics, and as she is a divorced woman the laws of the church will not permit a religious ceremony. He declares he has appealed to the pope for a special dispensation, but that the bishop has received no answer. He declares that he will not be a party to a civil marriage contract, as it is against the laws of the church.
