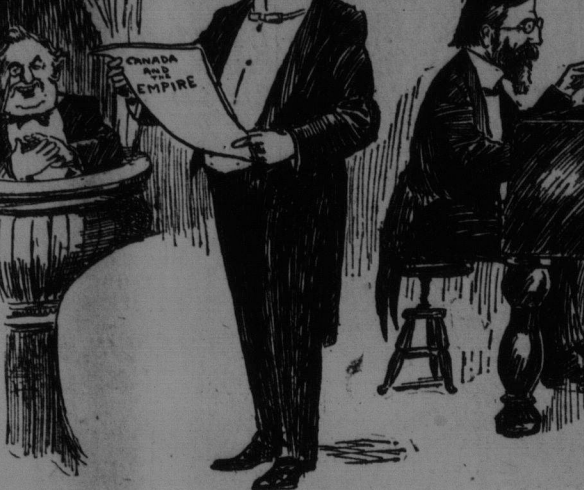

LABOR LEGISLATION PLANNED. London, July 23.—The Chancellor of Exchequer, David Lloyd George, announced in the House of Commons tonight the intention of the government to introduce a bill to deal with labor disputes such as the present dock strike. The chancellor did not define the measure but indicated that it was likely to involve compulsory arbitration and financial guarantees for observing agreements.

NEW JERSEY FIRST EASTERN STATE TO HOLD CONVENTION
State Ticket Same as that Sent by Republicans Pledged to Roosevelt — Enthusiastic Demonstrations.

Asbury Park, N. J., July 23.—New Jersey led the eastern states in the new party movement today when a mass convention of progressive Republicans launched a separate political organization and decided to nominate a full state ticket for the November election. The convention voted to put on the ticket a set of presidential electors supporting Theodore Roosevelt and sent to the National progressive convention in Chicago the same set of delegates that represented that state at the republican national convention, pledging them again to vote for Col. Roosevelt as the candidate of the new party.
