PRODUCES HEATED ARGUMENTS Vienna, May 13.—(By the Associated Press.)—Polish attacks in the region of Lemburg in the last few days failed completely, according to reports received here from Ukrainian sources. The Poles attempted a strong infantry charge against the Ukrainians, but were mowed down with much gunfre, leaving hundreds of dead behind them as they retired.

Marshal Foch Travelling To Area Of Occupation

Paris, May 14.—(By The Associated Press).—Immediate measures tending to the further subjugation of Germany if its delegates refuse to sign the peace treaty, were indicated today by the announcement that Marshal Foch had been sent to the Rhine by the Council of Four to take such action as may become necessary in the event that the treaty is not signed.

Marshal Foch is due to arrive at Coblenz on Thursday. He is making a trip which is taking him to the different headquarters of the occupied areas. The Marshal will go then from Mayence, and will be escorted down the Rhine by French gunboats. He will be entertained at luncheon by Lieut. General Hunter Liggett, commander of the American third army, and will then proceed to Cologne, inder the escort of British gunboats.
