

In the Treasurer's Report will be found full information as to the financial affairs of the Society. We have disposed of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) of Quebec Corporation debentures at one per cent premium, and re-invested the amount in Stadacona Bank at $1\frac{1}{2}$ per cent premium.

Our arrangements with the Finlay Asylum and Ladies' Protestant Home continue to be satisfactory, and the authorities of both are ever ready to promote the interests of our Society.

We are also again indebted to our physician, J. A. Sewell, Esq., M.D., for gratuitous professional services, always cheerfully rendered.

We have to thank the Richelieu Company for a free pass to Montreal, and the Quebec and Gulf Ports Steamship Company for several favors received.

On St. George's eve our Anniversary service was held in the Cathedral, when Revd. C. W. Rawson preached an appropriate sermon to a crowded congregation, and Revd. M. M. Fothergill assisted in the service. Mr. F. W. Mills, of Ottawa, kindly agreed to conduct the musical portion of the service, in which the ladies and gentlemen of the choir and others lent their very valuable assistance, to all of whom the Society is very much indebted. The collection in aid of the Charitable Fund amounted to \$102.46.

On the evening of St. George's Day, the members and their friends, to the number of about 100, dined together at the Russell House, where in social and friendly intercourse, a very pleasant evening was spent. This mode of celebrating the Day was adopted almost unanimously by our sister Societies throughout the Dominion and the neighbouring States.
