THE LONDON SCHOOL OF MEDICINE FOR WOMEN, in association with the Royal Free Hospital. Dean, Mrs. Garrett Anderson, M.D. Address: 30 Handel Street, Brunswick Square, London, W.C. It was founded in 1874, and of the whole number of women now on the British Register, 137 were educated either wholly or partly here. 162 students were reported in January, 1894, as attending the School or Hospital. Of 23 lecturers and demonstrators, 14 are women. The School prepares especially but not exclusively for the University of London and the Royal University of Ireland.

THE EDINBURGH SCHOOL OF MEDICINE FOR WOMEN, with clinical instruction in the Royal Infirmary. Dean, Miss Jex-Blake, M.D. Address: Surgeon Square, Edinburgh. Founded in 1886. Its five years curriculum is specially adapted to the requirements of the University of St. Andrew's and of the Conjoint Scottish Colleges, but qualifies for all other examining boards. H. R. H. the Duchess of Fife is its President.

QUEEN MARGARET COLLEGE, GLASGOW, with clinical instruction in the Royal Infirmary and Sick Children's Hospital. It was founded in 1883 as a Women's College, in connection with the Faculty of Arts in the University of Glasgow. Its School of Medicine was opened in 1890, and prepares for the Glasgow degrees.
