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Memorandum for the Prime Minister

I have given a good deal of thought to the idea which was discussed briefly with the Prime Minister some little time ago of a broadcast on Freedom in War Time.

A short anthology of extracts on the subject has been compiled and is attached. It makes a striking impression when all of them are read together, and strengthened my feeling that a whole broadcast on this theme would have a tremendous moral effect in demonstrating how continuously the P.M. had been concerned with the preservation of freedom — the freedom which we are defending.

There has been increasing evidence of public uneasiness about the war-time restrictions on freedom; their necessity and purpose has perhaps been less adequately
