
OTTAWA, 3rd February, 1905.

Gentlemen:-

In reply to your letter of the 1st Instant, inquiring as to the charge that would be imposed on Tamarac Net Poles 6 to 8 inches in diameter at the stump, I have to inform you that Section 30 of the Timber Regulations of this Department provides that no trees on Indian lands measuring less than 9 inches in diameter at the stump shall be cut.

The Department is aware that Tamarac trees generally are dead or dying, but no authority can be given to cut them while the Section referred to remains in force.
