Sir,-

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 15th instant enclosing a requisition for supplies for the Little Saskatchewan School.

In reply I beg to say that the articles considered necessary will be ordered from the Government Stationery Office to be forwarded to the teacher's address, with the exception of the desks, tacks, glass, storm sash and stove pipes.

You may purchase one package of tacks, five panes of glass 12" by 13 15/16", seven lengths of stove pipes and two elbows, and you may have a storm sash 5' by 2' 5" made and the necessary panes of glass put in it. You should forward accounts, in duplicate, properly certified, for the expenditure incurred in the purchase of these articles.

In regard to the seats asked for, the teacher states that the old seats in the school are in bad repair. Kindly state whether these seats could be repaired and, if so, give an estimate of the cost of having them done. Kindly state also whether you think any new desks should be furnished this school and, if so, give the sizes and the number of each size and the prices at which you can obtain them.
