MR. HLLIS: That is the same thing as referred to in the officel schedule?

MR.BALLS: Yes.

MRR ALEXANDER: Gesetted into a record.

MR. RLLIS: There is no trouble there, is there?

MR.BALLS: No, I don't think there are eny other rights at all on that creek.

THE CHAIRMAN: Yes, there is a record right on the next lot,

MR.BALLS: Yes. They apparently get all the water they need there.

THE CHAIRMAN: You intend to use the same intake according to the recordat ought to be a mile up the creek.

MR.BALLS: Yes, but I think they can use the old intake on their record. It will mean a new application for any additional water.

THE CHAIRMAN: What is the smount of the record?

MR.BALLS: 30 inches. They are irrigating about 60 seres of land, that is partly.

THE CHAIRMAN: Yes.

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MR.BALLS: Upper Similkameen Number 5, Lulu. Provincial record dated January 50th, 1897, for 100 inches of water from Lulauleub Creek. I think that is just Lulu Greek.

Do they get all the water they went on the Lulu Reserve

MR.BALL: You.

MR. BLLTS: That seems to find h it, Mr. Chairman.

THE CHAIRMAN: You.

MR.RLLIS: I was just going to say, Mr.Commissioners, I would
