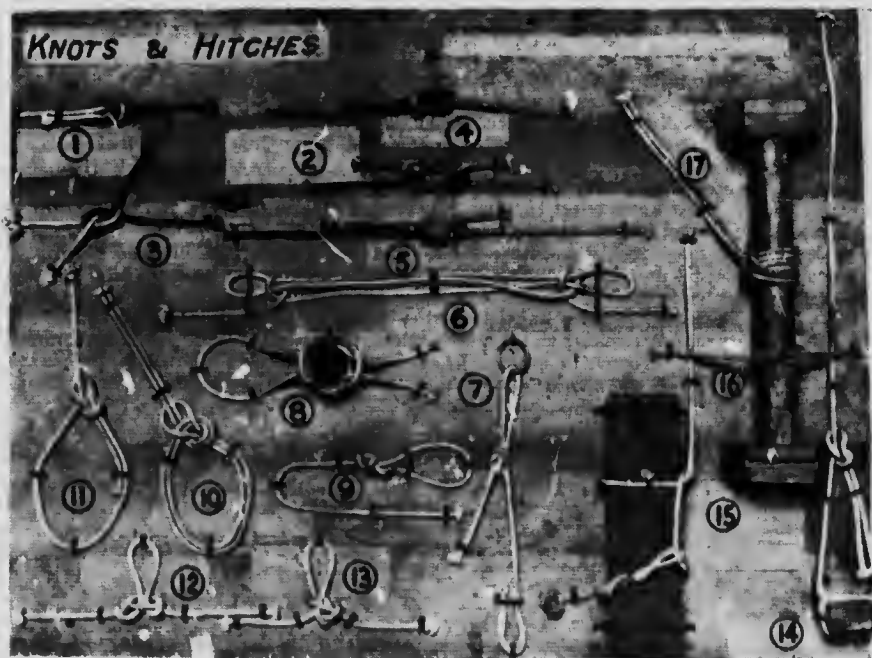
"Rope Knots and Hitches"

Can you splice a rope?
