A Bill for erecting a Court-House and Gaol in the County of *Westmorland*, and for altering the Shire-town of the said County—was read the third time as engrossed.

*Ordered*, That the said Bill pass—and be sent up for concurrence.

Read the second time—a Bill for appropriating certain Monies for defraying the expences of the Province—and a Bill for granting certain Sums for repairing and laying out Roads.

*Ordered*, That the said Bills be committed.

Read the third time as engrossed—a Bill for raising a Revenue in this Province.

*Ordered*, That the said Bill pass—and be sent up for concurrence.

House in Committee—

Captain *Agnew* in the Chair—

Took into consideration a Bill for appropriating certain Monies for defraying the expences of the Province.

The *Speaker* resumed the Chair—

The Chairman reported—that the Committee had taken the said Bill into consideration—and had agreed to the same.

*Ordered*, That the report be accepted—and that the said Bill be engrossed.

Read the second time—a Bill to explain and amend an Act, intituled, “an Act for appointing Commissioners of Sewers.”

*Ordered*, That the said Bill be committed.

House in Committee—

Captain *Agnew* in the Chair—

Took into consideration a Bill for granting certain Sums for repairing and laying out Roads.

The *Speaker* resumed the Chair—

The Chairman reported—that the Committee had taken the said Bill into consideration, and had agreed to the same.

*Ordered*, That the said report be accepted—and that the Bill be engrossed.

A Message from the Council, informing the House that the Council have concurred in passing the Bill “to empower the Justices of the Peace for the County of *York*, to make such regulations respecting the Winter Roads or Highways in that County, as may be found necessary”—with several amendments.
