TOWN COUNCIL.—The Town Council assembled on Wednesday evening, 25th inst., at the call of the Mayor. Present, the Mayor, Rev. George H. Bradley, A. D. Freeman, H. Marinson, Wm. Hess, Jas. Binning and Dr. Dillabough. After minutes of previous meetings had been read and approved, the Mayor read an application from J. C. McLeannan, Esq., of Guelph, for a liquor license. The Mayor thought that with a large share of the town, it would be advisable to extend the number of shop licenses. After a short discussion, a motion was passed to introduce a By-law to amend By-law No. 52, limiting the number of shop licenses to two. By-law No. 54 was then introduced. The Council resumed, and the Mayor introduced By-law No. 52, which was read by Mr. Joseph Goodrich, of Oshawa, in reference to forming a stock company in Listowel for the manufacture of tools. The license was refused. The Council then adjourned.

P. D. & L. H. R.—The general annual meeting of the shareholders and bondholders of the above-named railway, was held in the town hall, on Wednesday, 25th inst. The meeting was fully attended. The Mayor of Woodstock, Mr. Stoddart, occupied the chair. The Mayor's report was read by the Secretary, H. W. Saxeby, and adopted by the meeting. The election of directors for the coming year resulted in Messrs. D. Dillabough, J. Barker, P. J. Clarke, G. Moore, S. S. Fuller, J. Jackson and E. C. Macdonald. Messrs. Saxeby and E. Lalonde. At a subsequent meeting of the Board Col. Tisdale was re-elected president and Mr. H. Barker vice president. The gross earnings of the road for the past year were \$252,271.66, being \$14,047.07 over the corresponding period of 1878. The total cost of the road was \$275,702.02, leaving a deficit of \$23,430.36, which was applied to payment of bond interest, repair debt, and on construction. The Board has been in better order. New machinery has been added to the shop, giving facilities for repairs of all kinds. Arrangements are being made to establish a large coal trade and make a regular traffic connection during the coming season of navigation between Toronto and Erie, Pa.

We are of the opinion that her removal from the school Board would result in an extremely difficult matter to procure an efficient person to fill her place, even at the same salary. How they will do so at the reduced salary which they have committed themselves to remains to be seen. Those who have the real interest of education at heart, may well begin to fear for the future of our public school when they see the effect this "penny wise, pound foolish" policy of the Board is doing.
