

TORONTO LIVE STOCK. TORONTO, Sept. 1.—Receipts of live stock at the City Yards were 12 carloads, comprising 155 cattle, 42 hogs. 598 sheep, and 24 calves.

Trade in cattle was slow, as they were generally of common to medium quality. Butchers' steers and helfers sold from \$4.50 to \$5.40; cows, at \$3.50 to \$5; calves, \$5 to \$9; sheep, \$4 to \$5; lambs, \$7 to \$7.40. MONTREAL LIVE STOCK.

MONTREAL Sept. 1.—At the Montreal stock yards, west end market, the receipts of live stock for the week ended Aug. 30 were 2200 cattle, 2500 sheep and lambs, 2575 hogs and 1125 calves. The supply on the market today for sale amounted to 1450 cattle, 2705 sheep and lambs, 1400 hogs and 750 calves.

The feature of the trade today was the demand from American buyers for common small bulls for shipment to Buffalo, and as the offerings of such were large a fairly active trade was done in this direction at \$3.25 to \$3.50 per 100 pounds. There were also some buyers from Boston on the market, but as they could not secure the class of stock wanted at their price, little business was done for shipment to that market. There was no actual change in the condition of the market cattle, prices being fairly steady owing to the fact that the supply of the top grades was not large, for which there was a good demand from butchers and packers, and trade on the whole was active. Sales of full loads of choice steers were made at \$6.75; good at \$6.25, and fair at \$5.25 to \$5.50 per 100 pounds.

The demand for small meats was good and as the offerings were large an active trade was done. Western lambs were firm at \$6.50 to \$6.75, but the market for Quebec lambs was stronger at an advance of 10c per 100 pounds, with sales at \$5.85 to \$6.35 per 100 pounds. A good many grass fed calves were bought for shipment to Buffalo at 3½c to 3½c per pound, and sales of milk fed stock were made for local account at from \$6 to \$10.60, sows at \$8.50 to \$3.60, and stags at \$4 to \$5.50 per 100 pounds weighed in the market for live hogs, but prices showed little change, there being a good demand for selected lots at from \$6 to \$10.60, sows at \$8.50 to \$3.60, and stags at \$4 to \$5.50 per 100 pounds weighed off cars.
