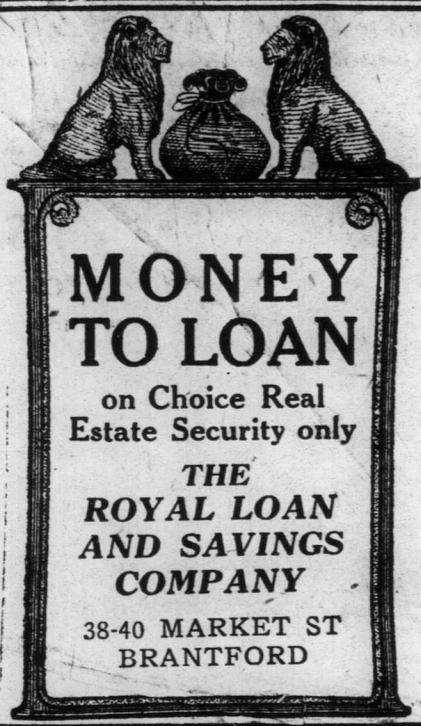

FAREWELL SERVICES AT IMMANUEL BAPTIST CHURCH

Pastor C. J. Loney Bids Congregation Farewell.

Farewell services at Immanuel Baptist Church were largely attended. Rev. Clifford J. Loney, pastor of Immanuel Baptist Church, after a very successful pastorate, bid farewell to his congregation on Sunday.

In spite of the disagreeable weather a large congregation gathered at the morning service. Rev. Mr. Loney delivered a strong and forceful sermon on the subject, "The King's Business," based on the words "Occupy Until I Come."

The speaker showed that the interests of the Kingdom of God were the supreme things in every man's life. "This was the supreme thing in the life of Christ himself. As a boy of twelve, he realized that this was the great purpose of his life, when he said, 'Wist ye not that I must be about my Father's business.' It is the supreme business of every Christian to serve the King and to promote his interests in the world."

Like the nobleman in the parable, Christ has entrusted the earthly interests unto us. His followers and the extension of the Kingdom of God depends upon the fidelity of the individual Christian. The talents represent the varied powers which God has given to His children to carry forward the interests of His Kingdom. We each have all the capital that is required to do the business God has asked us to do.

Continuing, the speaker asked what kind of business his hearers were doing for Christ, and reminded them that it was not what they had but what they used, that counted. Better make a small business pay, than be ruined by a big one.

Mr. Loney then illustrated what successful business for Christ was and how it was carried on by the early church. The secret of success might be summed up in one word, "Faithfulness."

Having enumerated the profits and blessings that come to those who were faithful to their trust, he made reference to the work that had been done in the church, and paid tribute to the beautiful spirit of harmony and of the loyal support he had received during the past year.

In closing, he asked the church to stand together, to be loyal to the Bible, the church and one another, and to show an unbroken front to the world. Make the Bible a united factor, and not as some, a dividing factor. Remember, that you and I must one day hand our record and our time sheet into the hand of our Master.

In the afternoon the pastor spoke a few parting words to the members of the Sunday School in which he had been specially interested. He urged them to accept and serve Christ.

At the evening service Mr. Loney delivered an unusually strong and fervent sermon to a large and appreciative audience, which filled the church to its uttermost capacity.

The theme considered was, "Is there a Heaven," based on the words of John 14: "In my Father's house are many mansions. The speaker introduced the subject by referring to the story of the Fall, in Genesis, and showed how that all man had lost and more, was regained in the Homeland of the soul through our Lord Jesus Christ.

Heaven is the landing place of the Bible. There are many arguments for the belief in Heaven, but we must not forget that all arguments for the existence of heaven are applied equally for the existence of hell. The first outstanding argument in favor of the existence of a heaven was a popular belief that had always throughout all ages been held in favor of an after life.

The Egyptians in embalming their dead as mummies in order to prepare them for the future life. The peculiar custom of the Indians, the Norsemans, the Greenlanders, the Chinese, in regard to their dead, all tended to prove that the general belief was that there existed a home-land for the soul. All cannot be deceived. The universality of the belief in the great argument in favor of its justification.

In the second place it was a generally conceded fact that all really bad men were not adequately punished in this world, and similarly others were not awarded according to their dues. Thirdly there was the scriptural argument in favor of the existence of heaven. The bible had opened its pages in the garden of Eden and passing through a long period of sin and strife, had terminated in the paradise regained our heavenly home.

This grand and glorious home-land of the soul is represented under different figures. It is called a kingdom, a kingdom of righteousness and peace, whose king is love, where millions of loyal and loving subjects serve the kind for ever.

It is a heavenly country, where all is beautiful and delightful, where the Good Shepherd leads his flocks by crystal streams. It is a heavenly city, with gates of pearl and streets of gold and walls of precious stones, where there is no hall, no parlors, no card tables or theatres. At this point the speaker declared heaven would be a mighty slow place for some folks, and in fact there would have to be a big change even in some professing Christians if they were ever to see heaven.

Finally, heaven is a home of many wonderful and beautiful things, where there would be joy and happiness in the service of the Lord. This home is to never pass from us, here we shall meet to part no more, but where we shall meet and recognize those loved long since and lost awhile.

An earnest appeal was made to accept Christ and make sure of heaven, to which at least one responded publicly. The ordinance of baptism was administered to two candidates, after which the Home Circle's song service was held, which had a record attendance.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

THE sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within five miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required, except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after entering homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$300.

The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, stony or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.
