FRANCE GIVES LAND TO CANADA 250 Acres on Vimy Ridge Now Belong to Dominion-Memorial Will

Ottawa, Dec. 7.-The gift of 250-acres of land on the Vimy Ridge, France, to Canada by the French government wa officially confirmed today by Premier Ming. Hon. Rodolphe Lemieux, Speaker in the House of Commons, who is at present in France was cabled today to sign the deed on behalf of Canada and officially accept the title. 


