MOROCCAN REBELS SURRENDER.

MEKKA, Spanish Morocco, Aug. 15. Five thousand rebel tribesmen surrendered unconditionally to the Spanish and French forces which captured the Rasur Heights position.

FRANCO-GERMAN FRONTIER TREATY SIGNED.

PARIS, Aug. 15. A treaty between France and Germany defining the frontier between the two countries was signed at the Foreign Office yesterday. The document restores the line to where it was at the time of the outbreak of the Franco-Prussian war in 1870.

PRINCE SAILS FOR BUENOS AIRES.

MONTEVIDEO, Aug. 16. The Prince of Wales, after a three-day visit to Uruguay, sailed this morning for Buenos Aires on the cruiser Carles, accompanied by a squadron of Uruguayan warships. The Prince on Saturday made a most favorable impression at a luncheon given by the Anglo-Uruguayan community of Montevideo, by responding briefly to the toast in Spanish. His words were received with great applause and the guests sang, "For he's a jolly good fellow." The Coal Situation in U.S.A.

The present conference between Pennsylvania coal operators and the officials of the Miners' Union will in all likelihood result in a settlement, and further more it looks pretty much like the last kick of union domination in the coal fields of the United States. Within the last year or two the non-union fields of that country have increased their production very materially while the unionized fields have steadily lost tonnage. That is to say the Kentucky, West Virginia, Alabama and Tennessee coal districts, which are largely, if not completely non-union, have either held or increased their tonnage, comparing the present year with former periods, whereas the unionized districts of Pennsylvania, Illinois, Indiana and Ohio have all lost enormously in tonnage. Indeed, the soft coal trade in the last named four states is shot to pieces and many mines, heretofore productive have closed until such time as there is a decided change in the situation.

As regards the anthracite trade these mines have also been steadily losing their custom under union domination. The public has its back to the wall and is refusing to pay the prices asked, and it is stated authoritatively that in order to market anthracite it has been found necessary to sell twenty per cent. of the year's output; that is to say eighteen million tons, at a small loss in order to get it moving.

Such being the case there is not the slightest chance for Mr. Lewis and his friends of the Mine Workers' Union to force from the operators any other advance in the wage scale, which in turn would be passed on to the consumer. Up to very recently the hard coal user has stood the gaff of ever advancing prices, but apparently the limit has been reached. The operators with their sales department close to the public pulse realize this and the Miners' Union should have sense enough to realize it also. They are simply killing the geese that lays the golden eggs in their insatiable desire for higher and yet higher wages. The coal-consuming public have been robbed and frozen and scared sufficiently long by these coal mine pirates, but they operators or workmen. As a matter of fact the casualties in coal mining are far less than on the highways of the continent.

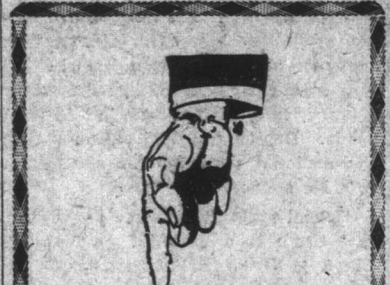
