A number of weeping women, with a sprinkling of the legal profession and a host of seandai-hunters made up the audience that filled Squire Peter's court yesterday afternoon, when the case against Samuel Walker, charged by Mrs. Mary Manning with the seduction of her daughter Sabina, was called. All the parties directly interested live in the vicinity of Belmont. The principal witness examined was the hapless victim Sabina Manning, who is a sister-in-law to the accused, and is less than 15 years of age. She is in a delicate condition, and as she recited the story of her downfall her female relatives wept copionaly. She stated that her mother went away and left her aloue for awhile in February last, during which time her sister, the wife of the accused, invited her to make her home with them. It was during this visit that the first offense was committed, it being again repeated in March. The evidence of the girl's mother was taken, bearing chiefly on the girl's age, and points of minor importance. On the conclusion of the case Squire Peters committed Walker to trial. Ball was offered for his release but was refused. Crown Attorney McKillop conducted the prosecution. As the girl is under 16 years the case will come under the Charlton Act.


