The status of the Mormons in Germany was taken up in exchange between the foreign offices and the United States embassy in 1903, when the Government took the position that the teachings of the missionaries were subversive of morality. It was then arranged with the Mormon superintendent, through the United States embassy, that all Mormon missionaries should withdraw from the country within a month, transferring the middle European headquarters from Berlin to Switzerland. Subsequently 140 foreign leaders departed, leaving the German societies, with a membership of a thousand, in the care of German

The authorities state that in recent the understanding of 1903, and from time to time individual missionaries have been apprehended and expelled. In such instances they have not applied to the United States embassy for relief, nor made a protest against their expulsion.
