NOTES AND COMMENTS.

Wm. J. O'Connor, the Canadian oarsman, was defeated by Stansbury the Australian, in the race which took place on Monday on the Paramatta River.

A convention has been signed between the Postmaster-General of Canada and the Postmaster-General of Japan for the establishnent of a direct parcel post service between Canada and Japan, commencing on Oct. 1st next. Vancouver will be the Canadian point of distribution:

The chances are that the cholera epidem ic which has broken out in Spain will not cross the Atlantic, but it would be criminal for the saniary authorities of this country to neglect any reasonable precaution against the introduction of the disease into the Dominion. Cholera travels by the dirtiest routes, other conditions being equal.

Last Friday was a Black Friday in Canada; two men having been executed that Peter Davis was hanged at Belleville for the murder of Wm. Emory. He died protesting his innocence. At Quebec Ran-olphe Dubois was executed for the murder of h is wife, mother-in-law and two children. Dubois confessed his crime, which was of the most revolting nature.

Lord Salisbury's government had a very narrow escape. Its Licensing Bill, which contains clauses giving compensation to publicans whose licenses are abolished, is meeting with great opposition throughout the country, and in the House. The first division on the measure was only carried by a majority of four. It would not have been carried at all if all Mr. Parnell's tollowers had been on hand at the right moment to

Toronto property holders are protesting against the practice of arresting drunken people, which they say is only done to run up expenses and make costs. In a meeting assembled, the property owners passed a resolution, calling upon the authorities to allow ordinary peaceable drunks to go their way unmolested. It seems that 5,451 drunks were arrested in that city last year, and the propery owners think the city would save money by leaving such alone in future.

An Ottawa despatch says that the Minister of Customs has granted the privilege of allowing American horses to enter Can-ada in bond, for feeding purposes. It appears that better grazing can be obtained in the Niagara peninsula than in northern New York, and for this reason a number of Buffalonians desire to send their horses into Canada for summer grazing. The conession made by Hon. Mr. Bowell will be of considerable advantage to the farmers of Welland, Lincoln and adjacent counties

But tor various reasons the councillors who have the matter in hand wly. of the County Council, the reform got a set-back, and the whole matter will now likely be submitted to a vote of the taxpayers at the coming municipal election. The question should be simply whether or not the people favor the establishment of a House of Industry. Middlesex would not return to the old haphazard system for a good deal .- Advertiser.

In consequence of insufficient or se drainage it would be safe to put down the loss in crops this season at thousands of dollars in almost every county in the Province of Ontario. In many quarters just as the crop were beginning to make a vigorous growth, came a succession of heavy rains. On clayey soils not drained whole fields or portions of them were drowned out. A few belated tarmers who had not finished seeding found themselves thrown a week or more further behind. A great deal of corn was put in too late, some not at all, the fields being too water-soaked to work. Thus the whole season's operations are delayed, involving loss in many ways and weeds get an unprecedented start. In the whole range of the farming industry there is perhaps no more hopeless case than the short-sighted man who begrudges a few dollars and a little labor to put down tile drains. No invested money brings a more certain or speedier return. It not only increases crops but reduces the difficulties of working the land and facilitates the year's operations all round. It saves wear and tear on man, beast and

implements, and incidentally prevents a lot of worry to the farmer, which is a point worthy of more consideration than it often

The Presbyterian Church of Canada has proved that union is strength. In 1888, there were 119,985 attending Sunday school and Bible class, and in 1839 there were 124,310, an increase of 4,325. The total amount of ministers' stipends was \$777.199, an increase of 39,000. For all purposes there was raised \$2,055,951, of which \$1,640,814 was devoted to all congregational purposes, and \$288,117 to the salaries of the Church. This is an increase of \$112,228 since last year.
