Whereas it being considered by this Board highly necessary and expedient that the committees of the several Parishes and districts within this County should from time to time with all possible despatch cause to be moved every thing which may by the said committees be considered offensive, noxious or likely to cause the spreading of any diseases, Mistaken, or injure the public Health.

Therefore Resolved, that every person (either landlord or occupier of premises, or of a shop house or occupier of a room or rooms, or who do not reside in the town or parishes) who

cause to be removed, such nuisance or  
nuisances upon being directed so to do by  
of the Committee for the parish or dis-  
trict wherein such nuisance or nuisances may  
exist, shall for every first neglect or refusal,  
commit and pay a penalty of twenty shillings;  
and for every second offence the penalty of forty-  
shillings, and for every subsequent offence a  
penalty of five pounds to be recovered as by  
law directed.
