The above list of words is <u>not</u> arranged according to any known principle, but merely to illustrate the variety of compositions with $\bar{a}q$ - in Kootenay.

It is evident that -k, $-k\bar{c}$, -kin, $-k\bar{c}$, -kits, $-(k)it\bar{t}$, &c., are qualifying affixes, but at present it is impossible to state with certainty their several meanings. In

but at present it is impossible to state with certainty their several meanings. In the last group of words in the first column there is the idea of 'tree, branch,' at the bottom of most of them, and in the case of 'star' and 'sky' a correlation is certain. But of the rest of the list nothing can be stated with certainty.

However, $\bar{a}'qkin\bar{u}'tl\bar{u}m$, 'snake,' and $\bar{a}qk\bar{u}'tl\bar{u}m$, 'eel,' seem related, as perhaps are also the words for 'belly,' 'cricket;' 'fly.'

It might be mentioned that several words have more than one form, thus:-

tree = $\bar{a}'qkitstl\bar{a}'in$; $\bar{a}'qkinitstl\bar{a}'in$. head = $\bar{a}qktl\bar{a}m$; $\bar{a}qk\bar{a}'tlam$. cloud = $\bar{a}qk\bar{a}tl$; $\bar{a}'qkink\bar{a}'tl\bar{a}h$. sand = $\bar{a}'qkink\bar{a}'tl$; $\bar{a}'qkink\bar{a}k\bar{a}'tl$. name = $\bar{a}'qk\bar{t}l\bar{t}'yam$; $\bar{a}'qk\bar{b}tl\bar{t}'yam$.

On another occasion the writer may be able to further discuss this interesting feature of the Kootenay language.
