Two serious mine explosions have occurred in West the mine of the Penstwo weeks. The first was in the mine of the Pensylvania Consolidated Coal Co., near Buckhannon, and is supposed to have been caused by the ignition of a can of powder. Twelve men were killed. A tew days later a gas explosion in the Stuart mine of the White Oak Fuel Co., near Fayetteville, killed upwards of 75 men.

Complete reports received from every iron furnace in the country by the American Iron & Steel Association show that the total production of all kinds of pig iron throughout the United States in 1906 was 25,307,191 gross tons, against 22,992,380 tons in 1905. The production in the second half of 1906 was 142,691 tons greater than in the first half.
