THE British trade reports for the year ended December 31st, 1884, show that Great Britain exported 271,077,900 pounds of cotton yarns, valued at £13,811,767, against 264,772,000 pounds valued at £13,509,722 for 1883. The exports of cotton piece goods for the year of 1884 amounted to 4,417,481,000 yards valued at £51,661,408, against 4,538,888,500 yards valued at £55,534,166 for 1883. For January and February, 1885, the exports of cotton varns amounted to 39,297,600 pounds, against 43,675,500 pounds for the same months in 1884. The decrease in quantity of yarus for this year has been more than overcome by the increase in the quantity of cotton piece goods for the same time, which amount to 767,360,600 yards, against 689,923,300 yards for January and February, 1884.
