NEWSPAPERS IN 1888.

From the edition of Geo. P. Row ell & Co's "American Newspaper Directory," published April 2nd (its twentieth year), it appears that the Newspapers and Periodicals of all kinds issued in the United States and Canada, now number 16,310, showing a gain of 800 during the last twelve months, and of 7,136 in 10 years.

The publishers of the Directory assert that the impression that when the proprietor of a newspaper undertakes to state what has been his exact circulation, he does not generally tell the truth is an erroneous one; and they conspicuously offer a reward of \$100 for every instance in their book for this year, where it can be shown that the detailed report received from a publisher was nutrue.

Chicago has a population of nearly 700,000. Over four thousand buildings were erected last year, covering more than twenty miles of street frontage, and costing nearly twenty million dollars.
