## CAMEROON-CANADA ECONOMIC SEMINARS

The Honourable James Kelleher, Minister for International Trade, announced today that following the Second Session of the Cameroon-Canada Bilateral Commission held in Ottawa from May 6 to 8, 1985, a series of Economic Seminars will be held in Vancouver on May 9, 10 and 11; in Toronto on May 12 and 13; and in Montreal on May 15, 16 and 17.

Those Economic Seminars are jointly organized by the Cameroon Government, the Canadian Export Association and the Department of External Affairs, and are intended to bring to the attention of the Canadian public, and especially of the business community, the trade and economic opportunities which Cameroon offers. An important delegation comprising five Cameroon ministers and led by His Excellency Mr. Youssoufa Daouda, Minister of State for Planning and Land Management, will meet leaders of the Canadian business community in those three cities that are Canada's leading economic and financial centres.

Mr. Stewart McInnes, Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for International Trade, will preside the Economic Seminars in Vancouver, while the Honourable Gerald Merrithew, Minister of State for Forestry, and the Honourable André Bissonnette, Minister of State for Small Businesses, will do likewise in Toronto and in Montreal respectively.
