Questions YMCA-YWCA CAMPAIGN

Question No. 2,211-Mr. MacEwan:

- 1. Is the Government of Canada contributing to the YMCA-YWCA campaign for Ottawa and, if so, what is the amount which has been or will be contributed?
 - 2. What is the purpose of the contribution?
- Hon. E. J. Benson (Minister of Finance): 1. A contribution is being made to the Ottawa YM-YWCA Building Fund of \$1,000,000, of which \$700,000 has been paid in the 1968-69 fiscal year and \$300,000 is to be paid in the present fiscal year.
- 2. As its Centennial Project, the Ottawa YM-YWCA undertook a development program to improve its facilities in the National Capital. The contribution was made as a testimonial of government appreciation of the "Y" movement throughout Canada, and a recognition that the YM-YWCA in the National Capital has obligations not incurred by other local associations in this national movement.

GRAIN SALES COMMISSION FIRM

Question No. 2,212-Mr. Southam:

Will the government give consideration to establishing forthwith a fully Canadian orientated grain sales commission firm charged specifically with the responsibility in co-operation with the Canadian Wheat Board of selling Canadian wheat feed grains and oil seeds?

Hon. Jean-Luc Pepin (Minister of Industry, Trade and Commerce): Several fully Canadian firms are agents of the Canadian Wheat Board and are engaged in the marketing of Canadian wheat, feed grains and oil seeds. The Government would welcome a decision by any of these firms to enlarge and expand their grain and oilseeds marketing operations and would also welcome the establishment of new firms with the capacity of expanding sales of Canadian grains and oilseeds.

WILDLIFE SERVICE ADVERTISING PROGRAM
