Question No. 2,058-Mr. Robinson:

- 1. Does the Department of Industry, Trade and Commerce have data processing equipment (automatic) and, if so, for how long?
- 2. What was the initial cost of the equipment?
- 3. What yearly costs are anticipated for data processing in the Department?
