

*The Constitution*

If you consider the statistics with respect to immigration in Quebec particularly since the years 1976, 1977, 1978, you realize that in 1976, out of 29,282 immigrants who came to Quebec, 11,991 came from countries where one of the national languages is English. In 1977, there was a big drop and out of 19,000 immigrants who came to Quebec, 5,477 came from English-speaking countries. In 1978, there was an even greater decrease and out of 14,000 immigrants who came to Quebec, 3,685 came from English-speaking countries. We are now

witnessing a restoration of the balance of English-speaking immigrants coming to Quebec in proportion with the English-speaking population in that province.
