My dear Professor Boycott:-

You will doubtless recollect the discussion which took place some time ago with the Rockefeller Foundation regarding the establishment of a Pathological Institute at this University and you will be interested to know that the building was completed during the past session and will be opened and put into service in October next.

We feel that we have every reason to be satisfied with the success of the endeavours that were made and that, with the assistance of the Rockefeller Foundation and the Royal Victoria Hospital, we have been able to obtain a Pathological Institute at least the equal of any on the continent. We propose that the formal opening shall take place on the afternoon of the 6th of October next, which is our Founder's Day, and that the usual Convocation be held in the evening. We intend to invite a number of guests as great as the seating capacity of the auditorium of the Pathological Building will permit to be present at the opening ceremony and we are anxious to have a Commemorative Address delivered by a recognized authority.
