and arrived in Liverpool the same day. We put our baggage into the cloak-room at the Central Station, and went to see the chief passenger manager of the Dominion Line, at the offices in James Street. We arranged to go on board the R.M.S. Vancouver early on Friday morning by tender, so as to miss the rush from the special train from Euston.

Subsequently we called on Mrs. Williams, of Fraser Street, and remained there for the night.

After breakfast next morning we went to the Central Station, got our baggage, and drove to the Prince's Landing Stage, went on board the tender and were taken out to the liner, which was lying in the Mersey. Miss Williams came to see us off, and went with my wife to look a
