GENERAL RULES.

58. All decisions, unless otherwise provided for by the Charter and By-laws of the Corporation, shall be by a majority of the votes of the Members present.

59. No debate shall arise or decision take place on any question, unless the subject be before the chair, on a written motion, and seconded.

60. When a Member speaks on a question, he shall rise and address the Chair, and no person shall speak twice on any question, except in explanation, or by leave of the chair.

61. Questions relating to party politics or religious controversy, shall on no account be admissible in the debates or discussions.

62. In all points not noticed by the Charter or By-laws of the Corporation, the Society shall be governed by the established usages of similar institutions in Great Britain.
