2. The said Eleonora Elizabeth Tudor may at any time hereafter marry any man whom she might lawfully marry in case the said marriage with the said Frederick Levey Hart had not been solemnized.

3. The said Eleonora Elizabeth Tudor shall have the permanent custody and sole and absolute control of the persons of her said children, Mary Edith Effie Tudor Hart, Ernest Percival Tudor Hart, Edith Ethel Alice Hart, and William Owen Tudor Hart, without any right of interference whatsoever on the part of the said Frederick Levey Hart. 5 10

4. In the case of the said Eleonora Elizabeth Tudor hereafter marrying, she and the man whom she so marries, and the issue, if any, of such marriage, shall have and possess the same rights in every respect as if her said marriage with the said Frederick Levey Hart had not been solemnized. 15
